presented a detailed presentation of the aroma plant cultivation sector in the country, as well as the legal framework governing their cultivation and the financial instruments related to tea cultivation in the country, by Ms. Io Chatzivaryti, external associate of the Drama Chamber for the TEAWAY project. Another good practice in the field of aromatic plants utilization was presented by the company PHYTOPLASIS, making a particular analysis of the potential of the region's flora and the range of aromatic plants available. This intervention ended the two-day study visit to Xanthi. The event was open to the public and was attended by existing and future businesses or individuals who cultivate, process or market tea and herbs.
